- _____ 2. This Election saw the first peaceful transfer of political power and the Presidency from one major political party to the other one.
- _____ 3. This election was one of the closest in history with JFK winning a controversial victory over Nixon in the State of Illinois to barely win the Electoral College.
- _____ 4. This transformative Election saw William McKinley defeat the Democrats as urban and industrial votes outnumbered rural farm votes for the first time.
- _____ 5. This Election saw Ronald Reagan win the biggest landslide victory in American history.
- _____ 6. This Election saw the advent of "Universal Suffrage" as all white males were allowed to vote regardless of wealth and property ownership for the first time.
- _____ 7. This transformative Election saw the Democrats sweep into both houses of Congress along with FDR for the first time.

- _____ 8. This Election was so close that the Chicago Tribune printed the headline "Dewey Beats Truman" only to retract it with much embarrassment the next day.
- _____ 9. This was the first Election where the "winner" only won when a political deal to end Reconstruction was struck. Even then President Hayes was called "His Fraudulency".
- _____ 10. This Election saw three major candidates with Taft and "T.R." splitting the Republican vote giving the Democrat Wilson the victory.
- _____ 11. This Election was the only time that a Presidential Elector deliberately voted against the will of the people so that Monroe would not tie Washington's distinction of being elected unanimously.
- _____ 12. This Election saw Reform Party candidate Ross Perot share equal billing with Bill Clinton & George H.W. Bush tilting the election to Clinton.
- _____ 13. This Election was the first in which all American Women could vote for President.
- _____ 14. This was the first competitive Election in U.S. History pitting the first two political parties against each other with Adams vs Jefferson.
- _____ 15. This Election saw the first President re-elected to a non-consecutive term, Grover Cleveland.
- _____ 16. This Election was surprisingly close considering the Democrats were split between Hubert Humphrey and George Wallace.
- _____ 17. This Election featured four major candidates and was settled in the House of Representatives by a "Corrupt Bargain".
- _____ 18. This Election saw the first and only President to be elected four times.
- _____ 19. This Election saw Lincoln win the majority in the Electoral College without winning a single southern state.
- _____ 20. This controversial election was settled by the Supreme Court who denied Al Gore a recount in the contested state of Florida.
