_____ 1. This major political party formed in 1856 largely in opposition to the westward spread of slavery; it became the party of big business interests.

_____ 2. This "splinter" party attempted to defeat Harry Truman in 1948 by depriving the Democrats of the support of the "solid south".

_____ 3. This party attempted to preserve the old union by running a moderate candidate, John Bell, in 1860; but it only found popularity in the Border States.

_____ 4. Created by Hamilton, this party favored a strong national government and a liberal constructionist view of the Constitution.

_____ 5. This small party grew out of the Temperance Movement and was instrumental in the passage of the 18th Amendment to the Constitution.

_____ 6. This short-lived party campaigned for John Q. Adams in 1824 as well as national funding of roads and canals connecting east and west.

_____ 7. This third party featured consumer advocate Ralph Nadar and may have cost the Democrats key votes in the 2000 Presidential Election.

_____ 8. This third party drafted the Ocala Platform which advocated for free silver and a graduated income tax for America's farmers.

_____ 9. This party consolidated into its modern form under Andrew Jackson. It has long claimed to be the party of the "common man" but also advocates for increased government.

_____ 10. This party formed out of the labor union movement. In the Election of 1912 their candidate for president, Eugene V. Debs, garnered over 900,000 votes.

_____ 11. This party formed in opposition to Andrew Jackson and was famous for running old war heroes and Henry Clay.

_____ 12. This economic protest party ran Arkansas billionaire Ross Perot for President while focusing on high Federal budget deficits as its main issue.

_____ 13. Created by Jefferson, this party believed in Strict Construction and that states should remain as powerful as the national government.

_____ 14. This "party" is best described as a political movement of libertarians and the extreme right wing of the Republican Party.

_____ 15. This political movement was not allowed to be a political party. Once they achieved their long term goal of suffrage, its members voted for other parties.

_____ 16. This political movement was dominated by the middle class and became a full political party in 1912 with the "Bull Moose" as its symbol.

_____ 17. This political party began as a hard fought effort by SNCC to get African Americans in Alabama and Mississippi to become registered voters. It then spread to big cities like LA.

_____ 18. This party came out of the "Nativist" Movement and was against immigration.

_____ 19. This party came out of the Abolitionist Movement and was against the westward spread of slavery.

_____ 20. This party ran George Wallace for President and attempted to preserve the culture of racial segregation. It garnered more Electoral votes than any other third party in history.
